Advise student to obtain a focused relevant history. This should contain all the information necessary to make a diagnosis of angina, ensure that angina is not unstable, and establish that treatment as recommended by guidelines is safe and acceptable to the patient.

No need to examine patient. Normal physical examination including blood pressure

Groups Remaining students to divide into 3 groups

Group 1. Observe and record content.

Group 2. Observe and record process.

'How has it been asked?'

Group 3. Observe and record perception.

'What issues have emerged and how have they been used to develop a focused consultation'
