I have applied my background in health behaviour to my education work through the direct teaching of public health and health behaviour content, the teaching of research skills and student research supervision, and the application of principles and knowledge to curriculum design and delivery.

I am passionate about communication in healthcare and am developing a strong program of work involving research into both the teaching and practice of healthcare communication. I have worked to develop my skills and theoretical knowledge in medical education pedagogy through career development opportunities and apply these knowledge and skills to curriculum development, teaching and student support, innovation, and evaluation.
